INTRODUCTION

1 Gentlemen, it gives me great pleasure to welcome you to the USI Annual Council Meeting for the year 2024. The USI has consistently scaled up its performance and growth, despite financial constraints. Particularly remarkable has been its endeavour to continually explore newer avenues and lines of efforts to not only enhance the image of the Institution but of the Indian Armed Forces and the Nation as a whole. The deserves compliments Management for its excellent achievements during the current year. It is noteworthy that today, various Centres of the Institution are financially selfsustaining. During the year, USI has a signed a number of MoUs, with national and international institutions, introduced new Chairs of Excellence (CsoE) and Memorial Lectures.

2. The Centre for Military History and Conflict Studies (CMHCS) deserves accolades for a well-organised 2nd edition of Indian Military Heritage Festival this year. After successful launch of 'Project Udbhav' in 2023, Project 'Veer Gatha' has been undertaken this year to create a robust ecosystem for preservation and promotion of military heritage. Similarly, after successful creation of Digital Archive for the Indian Army (IA), the Centre, this year, has undertaken a project for creation of Digital Archive for the Indian Army (IAF). Centre has also commenced a two-year MA programme in International Conflict Studies, in collaboration with the University of Ladakh (UoL).

3. The Centre for Strategic Studies and Simulation (CS3) continued with its niche in strategic Net Assessment studies and strategic gaming. The Centre hosted a number of seminars/webinars and round table discussions, focusing on geo-political and strategic security issues, and Multi Domain Warfare. The scope for Strategic Gaming Exercise (SGE) has increased considerably.

4. Recognising the domain expertise and the contribution of the Course Section (CS), IA (ARTRAC) designated CS as a node of excellence for the conduct of 'online phase' of command Pre-Staff Course for three subjects besides writing precis for promotion and competitive examination. Likewise, CS also undertook the task of conducting pre-staff course for the IAF and Indian Navy (IN) officers.

5. Consequent to Centre for UN Peacekeeping (CUNPK) becoming a full-fledged unit of the Indian Army, the USI is now focusing on the policy and doctrinal issues related to UNPK. This year, the USI, in collaboration with ICRC and CUNPK, conducted USI Annual UN Forum 2024 on the theme 'Changing Character of Conflicts: Challenges to Peace Operations and International Humanitarian Law'. USI has been nominated as one of the members of the four-member Advisory Committee by the Challenges Forum.

6. USI-ANBI (Atma Nirbhar Bharat Initiative) Cell has been established as a full-fledged Centre as 'Centre for Atma Nirbhar Bharat (CANB)' and has provided a platform to build synergy between users, designers, developers, and manufacturers with end-users, through collaboration in the field of disruptive and niche technologies. Another significant achievement has been the establishment of 'Cyber Centre of Excellence (CCoE)' at the USI, in collaboration with the Cyber Peace Foundation. A fully funded Cyber Responder Programme has been launched to develop cyber security and awareness in public.

7. The Editorial Section has continuously strived to ensure quality publications which includes the iconic USI Journal, being published since 1871. The prestigious USI Strategic Book 2024 was released this year by the CDS. There has been a publication significant increase in of Books and Monographs/Occasional Papers. The USL significantly expanded its presence on various digital platforms.

8. The Administration Section strived hard to improve infrastructure and enhance rental drive. Tally accounting system has been made functional leading to digitisation of accounts. Consequent to extension of land lease for 30 years, 50% reduction in property tax (shift from commercial to

private) was obtained from the Cantt Board. New payment gateway (rent-free) 'Point of Sale (PoS)' system for debit and credit card payments is fully functional. This makes transactions more convenient for our members.

9. It is my privilege to present the report of the Institution for the year 2024. A copy of the report has been placed on the table and its salient aspects will be included in the Minutes of today's meeting. The Calendar of Activities conducted during the year is at **Appendix 'A'**. Highlights of these activities during the year 2024 are contained in the succeeding paragraphs.

GENERAL ASPECTS

<u>Membership</u>

10. The Institution began with a membership of 215 members and increased to 3500 when USI moved to the present premises in 1996. Today, we have 14891 members. The drive to grant Civilian Special Membership to deserving cases has yielded good results. As of now, out of a quota of 100 members per year for this category, 12 membership cards have been issued. During the current year, 123 Life Members, 09 Associate Members, 489 Ordinary Members and 935 Course Members were enrolled. A special drive has helped in enrolling members from the Training Academies, Assam Rifles, and the CAPFs.

Administration Section

12. The Adm Section ensured timely maintenance and upkeep of the USI building and premises. During the year, upgrade of state-of-the-art audio/video equipment in Seminar Room 3, furniture upgrade in Seminar Room 2, installation of new RO systems and a new water motor were undertaken. Two new toilets were constructed, catering to the functions in the front lawns. Part of library space has been renovated to create additional office space for scholars. Auto Fire Balls have been installed within the premises.

Finances

13. USI continues to face acute financial constraints since 2011 due to lack of grant/aid from the Services or MoD. The USI Management resorted to extreme austerity measures such as suppression of permanent appointments, hiring of minimum number of researchers on contractual basis for the sponsored projects, freezing of annual increments and DA instalments for the staff. However, inescapable expenditure had to be made for bare minimum repairs, maintenance of old infrastructure, and upgrade of facilities in the seminar rooms.

14. All-out efforts were made by the USI to reach out to the Services, MoD, MEA, National Security Council Secretariat (NSCS) and DRDO for financial support. During the financial year no monetary aid was received but the USI was able to obtain projects on competitive basis from the Indian Army, Indian Air Force, and MoD, worth about Rs 4 crore. Release of these projects, notwithstanding, the financial status of the USI will remain critical unless there is major infusion of funds/grants from the Services/MoD. In the meanwhile, efforts to raise funds through collaborations with Indian Space Association, Cyber Peace Foundation, Indian Hotel Academy, rentals, fundingof Air Marshal Subroto Mukerjee and Admiral RD Katari CsoE, project 'Udbhav', Digital Archiving, and income from Residency have yielded good benefits.

15. The USI Audit Report and Balance Sheet for the FY 2023 - 24, Revised Estimates for the FY 2024-25, and Budget Estimates for the FY 2025-26 are submitted to the Council. These have been recommended by the Finance Sub-committee and Executive Committee for approval by the Council.

Director General's Interaction

16. During the year, DG regularly interacted with the RM, CDS, Service Chiefs, Defence Secretary and other senior policy-makers at the NSCS and Ministries to apprise them about USI functioning and seek their guidance and support. DG also met selected Heads of Missions and foreign delegations. He represented the USI at various national and international platforms to project the image of the Institution and foster

collaborations with various think tanks. He lectured at the prestigious military training establishments and think tanks in India and abroad. Details are at Para 17 and **Appendix 'A'**.

EDITORIAL SECTION

USI Publications

19. **USI Journal**. As the flagship publication of the institution, the USI Journal has been published continuously since 1871. It covers contemporary issues related to military heritage, national security, defence forces, and international relations, gaining global recognition for its insightful articles. The Journal features contributions from foreign scholars and has reviewed nine books in the past year. Since January 2017, it has been digitised, with only 1,000 print copies issued for institutional subscribers or those preferring a hard copy. The regular grant from the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) for the financial year 2024-25 is pending.

USI Strategic Year Book. The ninth edition of the USI 20 Strategic Year Book was launched by General Anil Chauhan, PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, SM, VSM, Chief of Defence Staff, on 21 May 2024. This edition features contributions from renowned authors addressing various facets of India's national security National six thematic sections: India's across Security Overview. Internal Security Concerns, Pakistan-China Collusivity, India's Strategic Neighbourhood, Global Issues, and National Security Capacity Building. Recognised as a seminal publication. the Year Book offers valuable insiahts for policymakers, academics, and the strategic community.

21. <u>Joint Publication with Army War College (AWC)</u>. A collaboration has been established between the USI and AWC to produce an annual publication focusing on strategic issues and warfare. The inaugural edition, titled 'India's Strategic Thought and Multi-Domain Warfare Perspectives', was unveiled by the CDS on 21 May 2024.

22. <u>Joint Publication with Assam Rifles</u>. The Assam Rifles is collaborating with the USI with a proposal to publish a joint publication that focuses on the North-East. The compilation of this publication is currently underway, with some articles already received from the Assam Rifles.

23. <u>Books, Monographs, and Occasional Papers</u>. During the year, 17 books, six Monographs, and eight Occasional Papers have been published, while four books and one Monograph are under publication. These include publications undertaken by CS3 and CMHCS. The details of publications are given at **Appendix 'B'**.

24. <u>Strategic Perspective and Blogs</u>. A total of 75 articles have been uploaded on the USI website. USI Blog was actively utilised by our scholars.

25. <u>Social Media and YouTube Videos</u>. To enhance the visibility of the USI in the digital realm, following initiatives have been launched:

(a) A partnership with Astitva Deep Vedic Research (ADVR), which will provide pro bono support for all video recordings and social media posts. This collaboration aims to leverage digital platforms for impactful outreach and optimise resources.

(b) A series of 12 Strategic Dialogues, an initiative to produce short YouTube videos with eminent strategists, have been recorded, with 10 already uploaded and two under production. Additionally, four videos featuring the DG were filmed, and have been uploaded on YouTube. The details are given at **Appendix 'C'**.

(c) The recording of the 'Global Heatmap', a weekly roundup of current affairs, has commenced, with nine episodes already available on YouTube.

(d) A campaign to increase the follower count on USI's social media platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and LinkedIn, has been initiated. All USI events are regularly posted on all social media.

26. <u>Website</u>. The USI has forged partnership with Ms Credent Infotech Solutions LLP to develop a new website. This initiative aims to enhance features and functionalities to improve user experience, aligning with USI's objectives. The new website will be 'Smart-Phone' friendly and is expected to significantly boost USI's online presence and operational efficiency with a modernised digital platform.

27. <u>Capsule on Space Laws and Space Domain</u>. A capsule on Space Laws and the Space Domain (second in the series) was conducted for IAF officers from 18th to 20th Sep 2024.

USI Library

28. The USI library with a collection of over 70413 books, some dating back to 16th and 17th centuries, is a storehouse of knowledge and archival material. During the year, a total of 209 books have been added to the library. The library has Army Lists since the days of the Presidency Armies, dating back to 1793 (Bombay Army List), which are sought after by many, to locate service details of their ancestors. As part of the Information Service for its members, the library is putting out 'Fortnightly First' twice a month. The 'Fortnightly First' contains five researched articles selected after a scan of national and international think tanks. Articles are then made available on the USI website under the Library drop down menu. Besides, it contains links for the USI articles and YouTube recordings of seminars/webinars conducted by the USI faculty.

Combined Operational Review and Evaluation (CORE) 46 Programme. For senior officers of the rank of Major General and equivalent rank officers from other services and civil services was conducted at USI from 09-13 Sep 2024, CORE programme consisted of lectures and panel discussions by subject experts to undertake a comprehensive assessment of various Indian strategic trends and concerns, nationally, and globally. The theme for Day 4 was "Strategic Leadership" with the sub-themes "Conflict as Management & Complex Negotiations", "Challenges of Strategic Leadership in Contemporary Times", and "Youth Leadership -Their Models of Success & Best Practices". The theme for Day 5 was Technology Infusion with sub themes being "The emerging Private Space Eco-System in India: Leveraging it for the Armed Forces", and "Adoption of AI in Military, and Security of Data, Connectivity and Cyber Space".

The two-day flagship event was inaugurated by the Gen Anil Chauhan, PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, SM, VSM, Chief of Defence Staff, in presence of Shri Shyam Saran, IFS (Retd), President IIC. Lt Gen Pratik Sharma, AVSM, SM, DCOAS, Vice Adm Tarun Shobti, AVSM, VSM, DCNS, Air Mshl Tejinder Singh, AVSM, VM, DCAS, and DG USI. The inaugural of the IMHF also witnessed the launching the project 'Shaurya Gatha' a joint initiative of DMA and USI of India to highlight India's military heritage and culture. The Festival witnessed 22 panel discussions, band presentations from the three Services, photo exhibition by the DRDO and display of stalls by the Army and Air Force along with other agencies. The festival also showcased the Induction Publicity Exhibition Vehicle by the Indian Air Force that was much appreciated by the young students from various schools and colleges along with NCC cadets. The fully sponsored event was financially supported by Ministry of Defence, DMA, DRDO, Indian Army, Indian Air Force, Tourism of Ladakh, Department of Tourism Arunachal Pradesh, Fortinet and British High Commission. Presence of Big FM 92.7 and exhibits from the three Services added flavour to the entire event. The closing ceremony was presided over by Amb Shyam Saran, President IIC in presence of Lt Gen Vipul Singhal, AVSM, SM, DICIDS (DoT), Air Mshl (Dr) Rajeev Sachdeva, AVSM (Retd), Chairman, Board of Management USI-CMHCS, DG USI, and Dir CMHCS.

51. <u>SGE for NWC</u>. USI conducted a SGE for Naval Higher Command Course (NHCC) at Naval War College, Goa from 18-20 Nov 2024. The USI team mentored the participants understanding and discussing scenarios in South China Sea and Taiwan Strait.

52. USI Annual UN Forum 2024. This collaborative event, with ICRC, was conducted on 27-28 Nov 2024 on 'Changing Character of Conflicts: Challenges to Peace Operations and International Humanitarian Law. Sub-themes were, Changing Character of Armed Conflicts, Evolving Conflicts - Challenges to Peace Operations and International Humanitarian law Protection of Civilians and Peacekeepers, Climate Change and UN Peace Operations, Women in UN Peace Operations – Key to a lasting Peace and Analysing the Future: Challenges and Opportunities for UN Peace Operations. Mr Jean-Pierre Lacroix. Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations, United Nations and Mr Alexandre Zouev, Assistant Secretary-General for Rule of Law and Security Institutions, Department of Peace Operations shared recorded video messages. However, Benoît Pylyser, Director, Challenges Forum participated virtually. Mr Shombi Sharp, UN Resident Coordinator in India; Ms Susan Ferguson, Country Representative, UN Women India and Ms Annika Hilding, GCSP, Geneva participated physically. The event was attended by diplomats, service officers, foreign and Indian peacekeeper and students of international relations. Other participants included former Indian Head of the UN missions, Force and Deputy Force Commanders, Deputy SRSG, UN Resident Coordinator, Head of UN Women India, Head of Regional Delegation, ICRC and recently de-inducted Indian peacekeepers. This event was also supported by CUNPK and MFA

53. Annual Essay Competitions

(a) <u>USI Gold Medal Essay Competition 2024</u>. A total of 92 entries were submitted on the topic 'Non-contact and Non-kinetic Warfare in the Indian Context: Concepts and Pathways'. 50 entries were disqualified for not meeting the competition guidelines. The remaining 42 entries were forwarded to three evaluators, each from a different service, for detailed assessment. The evaluations have been completed by the evaluators. The winners will be announced at the Annual USI Council Meeting.

(b) Lt Gen SL Menezes Memorial Essay Competition 2024. The subject of this year's essay competition was 'Meghna Heli Bridging Ops 1971 War : Appraisal and Lesson'. A total of 60 entries were received for this year's competition. On perusal 37 entries were found violating the rules of the essay competition and 23 entries were forwarded to the evaluators for evaluation. Results will be declared at the Annual USI Council Meeting.

(c) <u>USI-WAR Wounded Foundation Joint Essay</u> <u>Competition 2024</u>. The subject of this year's essay competition was 'Caring for the War-Disabled – How will their treatment impact future recruitment into the Armed Forces?'. A total of 66 entries were received for this year's competition. On perusal 35 entries were found violating the rules of the essay competition and 31 entries were forwarded to the judges for evaluation. Results will be declared at the Annual USI Council Meeting.

CENTRE FOR MILITARY HISTORY AND CONFLICT STUDIES (CMHCS)

54. During the year 2024, the CMHCS undertook various activities and submitted a number of major project proposals, details of which are in the succeeding Paras:

USI- War Wounded Foundation

55. As part of the USI-WWF collaboration, the second USI-WWF Chair of Excellence was awarded to Col Pronob Roy (Retd) for the year 2024-25. His research topic is 'Beyond the Battlefield: Analysing the Role of the Private Sector, Media, and Public in Supporting War-Disabled Personnel in India'.

56. The report of the previous study: 'Ground Realities, Gaps and Challenges in Access to Entitlements and Benefits for War Wounded Disabled Soldiers and Disabled Cadets' by Mrs Meghna Girish has been published as a Monograph. The same was released in presence of Gen Anil Chauhan, PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, SM, VSM, Chief of Defence Staff on the 08 Nov 2024 at the Indian Military Heritage Festival at India International Centre, New Delhi.

Joint USI-ICWA Project: Diplomatic Dimensions of Military History

57. Following the successful completion of the joint USI-ICWA International Conference titled 'Diplomatic Dimensions of Military History: Indian Armed Forces in France and Flanders during WWI And WWII' in April 2023, the Centre published a book titled 'Diplomatic Dimensions of Military History' was produced by the Centre during the year. The arguments presented during the conference are compiled in this volume, which is an attempt to demonstrate the importance of India's role in World Wars I and II in strengthening the capabilities, institutions and influence of its diplomacy.

Coffee Table Book on National War Memorial

58. USI-CMHCS produced a Coffee Table Book for the MoD which highlights the significance of the National War Memorial. Release of the publication is pending with MOD.

Setting up of the Kameng Cultural and Heritage Museum at Nyukmadung, West Kameng, Arunachal Pradesh

59. The Indian Institute of Heritage (IIH), Ministry of Culture, has approached the USI-CMHCS for setting up of the Kameng Cultural and Heritage Museum at Nyukmadung, West Kameng, Arunachal Pradesh.

60. The Centre assisted in preparing the narrative and curating displays highlighting the role of the Indian Army and Indian Air Force in military and aid-to-civil operations in Arunachal Pradesh (erstwhile NEFA). The Local Military Authority and Deputy Commissioner (DC), West Kameng/ADC, Dirang, Arunachal Pradesh, were also part of this project. On 24 July 24, first Content Evaluation Committee for the museum

was held at National Museum, Delhi, to evaluate the Themes and Concept Note, Content, Layout and Display Object List, etc which was attended by Director CMHCS.

USI-NAM British Indian Military Heritage Partnership

61. Work on two volumes of British Indian Army badges, which are to be produced under the British-Indian Military Heritage Partnership between USI and the National Army Museum, UK (NAM) is ongoing. Further details of the publication are under the head 'Ongoing Research'.

Military Museum Association of India

62. The Military Museums Association of India (MMAI) is a forum for military museums with substantial military heritage collections within India. So far seven military museums across the country are members of MMAI.

63. For the members of MMAI various courses are planned from this year. To start with, the Centre organised its first 'Conservator Course' (Refer Para 45 for details). This course familiarised the participants about the ethics of conservation, history of manuscripts, types of ink and other writing material, concept of preventive & curative measures, different methods of preservation, restoration of documentary wealth, challenges in conservational solutions, etc.

Military Heritage Tourism

64. The Centre collaborated with Andaman Anchorage to organise a trial tour of 7 days and 6 nights for Andaman Islands from 22-27 Apr 2024. After the success of trial tour, Andaman Anchorage organised its first tour with increased participation from 23-29 Sep 2024. Prospects are being explored with various state governments to develop military tourism in their respective States.

Project 'Shaurya Gatha'

65. The Project 'Shaurya Gatha' is an initiative of the DMA executed through the USI to preserve and promote India's

military heritage and culture. The project aims at preserving diverse aspects of India's rich military heritage of valour, sacrifice and service to the nation, by creating a National Military Heritage Conservation Policy, and a linked comprehensive National Education Programme. To identify, preserve, and showcase key military landmarks such as forts, battlefields, memorials, and museums, highlighting India's military heritage. The project was launched by the CDS on 08 Nov 2024 during the Indian Military Heritage Festival 2024.

Battlefield Guide Series

66. As part of the USI-CMHCS series of battlefield guides comprising of six books, the third book in the series 'India's Historic Battles: Imphal Kohima 1944' by Hemant Singh Katoch, was published in Mar 2024. Refer **Appendix 'B'** for details.

MA Program in International Conflict Studies (MAICS)

67. The Centre has collaborated with the University of Ladakh (UoL), Leh, to offer a two-year Master of Arts (MA) in International Conflict Studies (MAICS) program at the USI Complex in New Delhi. The aforementioned MA program blends subjects from academic disciplines like peace and conflict studies; international relations; and defence and strategic studies, which have gained immense popularity among enthusiasts of the liberal arts and social sciences in recent years. The program presents a unique opportunity for students to obtain a postgraduate degree from a premier public university after being trained within the ecosystem of a leading, New Delhi-based think-tank specialising in military and strategic affairs. The course has commenced wef 21 Oct 2024.

'Project Udbhav' 2023-24

68. Project Udbhav is a joint collaboration of the USI-CMHCS with the Indian Army to study the evolution of Indian Military Systems, Strategy, War Fighting and Strategic Concepts, with the aim of developing an indigenous strategic culture and vocabulary rooted in India's philosophy and traditions.

USI-NAM Military Museum Curator's Course

72. The sixth iteration of the Annual Military Museum Curators' Course was held at the USI from 04 to 07 Nov 2024. The course of this year was conducted in-person. It included representatives from the Indian Army, Navy, Air Force and representatives from Indian Institute of Heritage, Ministry of Culture. As part of the course this year, site visit to the Air Force Museum, Palam was organised.

73. The four-day training programme was conducted by trainers from the National Army Museum and the Gurkha Museum, UK along with speakers from India.

USI- MoD Gallantry Awards Portal

74. Gallantry Awards Portal (GAP) project is an initiative of Ministry of Defence (MoD), Government of India, first launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi in 2017. The MoD signed a MoU with USI-CMHCS in December 2021 to create a digital repository of gallantry award recipients of the Indian Armed Forces. It is a digital platform to immortalize our soldiers, seamen and airmen who valiantly guard our borders day and night to uphold the sovereignty and territorial integrity of the nation. The project strives to create a broad and inclusive digital repository (gallantryawards.gov.in) of all gallantry award recipients, engage with the public, and propagate a sense of civic consciousness among people. The portal currently has accounts of more than 4000 awardees. The USI is responsible for:

(a) Tracing the history of the Indian Armed Forces and creating a broad and inclusive online repository about awardees and related wars, battles, and operations.

(b) Content generation in the form of write-ups on wars, battles and operations, profiles of awardees, graphic

plates, audio-visual content and handling the GAP social media platforms.

(c) Developing holistic content for the GAP portal with the aim of creating a dynamic, interactive, and participatory online space and ensuring optimal reach and impact of the Portal.

75. This involves research from published military history books, MoD citations, and interaction with units and family members. Give publicity to the work being undertaken by publishing articles in various newspaper/magazines.

76. Project 'Veer Gatha' was instituted under Gallantry Awards Portal (GAP) in 2021 to disseminate the details of acts of bravery of the Gallantry Awardees and their life stories among the youth.

77. In its third edition, more than 1.36 crore school students from all 36 States and UTs participated. Super-100 winners of Project Veer Gatha 3.0 were felicitated by Raksha Mantri in New Delhi in the presence of Education Minister Shri Dharmendra Pradhan. The work on the 'Veer Gatha 4.0' has already started, and the GAP team has been involved with all the State and District level nodal officers for smooth implementation of the project on ground.

USI-CSKM Public School joint seminar on 'Kargil Operation: A Watershed in India's National Security in the Emerging Geopolitical Environment'

78. As part of the school's CSR activity, the USI conducted an inter-school seminar on military history titled 'Kargil Operation: A Watershed in India's National Security in The Emerging Geopolitical Environment' was hosted at the premises of CSKM public school to commemorate the 25th year of the 1999 Kargil Operations. An Art Exhibition, inaugurated by the DG, USI, where students presented 3-D models of the Kargil War, set the tone for the event.

79. The key feature of the Seminar was the student-led interschool syndicate group presentations covering military operations from 1962 to the Kargil War. DG, USI provided expert insights into the various military operations of the Indian Armed Forces.

80. A panel discussion, moderated by Maj Gen Jagatbir Singh, VSM (Retd), was also organised. The panellists, Brig Amul Asthana (Retd), Capt (IN) Sarabjeet Parmar (Retd), and Gp Capt VS Rana (Retd), shared their experiences with students.

Creation of Digital Archive for Paramilitary Forces

81. The Centre has put forward proposals to develop digital archives for the various paramilitary forces and Indian Coast Guard. The DIG ITBP, DG SSB and the Coast Guard, Assam Rifles and DRDO have shown interest in the proposal.

82. In Sep 2024, the DG Assam Rifles shared a comprehensive breakdown of the material to be digitised. It was intimated that the digitisation process of Assam Rifles will be considered in the next financial year (2025-26).

<u>Creating a Digital Archive for the Indian Army: Extension</u> <u>Phase</u>

83. In continuation of the Pilot project, an extension of another six months was assigned to the USI-CMHCS for the digitisation of 05 lakh more documents in the month of July 2023. Digitisation of one lakh pages was completed and accepted by Dec 2023. Proposal for further extension of project has been projected and is under consideration.

84. Gen Manoj Pande, PVSM, AVSM, VSM, ADC, the then COAS, officially announced the Indian Army Digital Archives project named 'Project Shaurya Sankalan' in Annual Press Conference 2024, on 11 Jan 2024.

Creating a Digital Archive for the Indian Air Force

85. The USI in collaboration with Air HQ Dte of Media & Public Relations and Space is working towards creating a digital archive for the Indian Air Force. The project, worth Rs 2.18 crore, undertakes digitisation of documents (including

handwritten/typed documents, photographs, maps, books etc.), conversion of audio and video tapes to digital format, and creation of customised Document Management Software (DMS).

Workshop on IAF Digital Archive and Record Management

86. The Centre has put up a proposal with IAF Dte of Ops (MPR) to train personnel who will be appointed as nodal officers responsible for identifying records for digitisation of IAF records and also for preservation under the statutory requirements of the Public Record Act. The proposal of workshop is under consideration with the Dte of Ops (MPR).

CWGC Non-Commemoration Project

87. USI CMHCS has collaborated with the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) to coordinate research in a project to address historical inequalities in commemoration of Indian war dead after the World Wars.

88. The project seeks to identify Indian casualties of WW1 and WW2 that are missing from the international CWGC database. Attempts for obtaining pre-independence regimental long rolls are going on. Assistance to facilitate access to the pre-1947 regimental long rolls from various record offices is being sought.

USI-IWM Collaboration

89. To work in areas of mutual interest in the field of British/Indian military history and heritage, an MoU has been signed with the Imperial War Museum (IWM), UK. The aim is to work together to further research, and make accessible collections and material which relate to the shared heritage of the British Army and Indian Army up to 1947, and to support activities which enable and encourage research and conservation, facilitate research scholars, and assist each other in mutually agreed projects.

90. As part of the collaboration, both institutions are working towards a proposed Exhibition on Indian Soldiers to be held in 2027. This project is conceived to be a chronological, object and story-led exhibition showcasing the contribution of Indian soldiers to pre-independence wars with a focus on the uneven

road to partition. This project will also explore cultural encounters and cover the role played by the Royal Indian Navy and Royal Indian Air Force.

112. <u>Online Pre-Staff Course (OPSC) 2025</u>. Planning for conduct of OPSC 2025 has begun based on feedback and experience gained in previous years. Online sessions of Current Affairs (CA), Science and Military Technology (SMT), and Military History (MH) will be undertaken, with suitable modifications.

113. <u>Courses for the IAF and the IN</u>. While the USI of India continued with the Professional Military Examination / DSSC for the IN, a large number of IAF officers undertook both the OPSC (for CA) and Correspondence Course (for CA and MH). In 2025 also, CS3 will conduct the above courses for IAF and IN with similar gusto, including preparing and providing study material to aspirant officers.

114. <u>Contact Programme (CP)</u>. Three Contact Programmes, in hybrid form, for the DSSC aspirants were conducted for 223 officers during the year.

115. <u>Provision of Empanelled Directing Staff</u>. Based on requirements of the Regional Commands, a number of USI of India empanelled Directing Staff are requested to assist Commands in conduct of the Offline Pre-Staff Courses on most subjects including Tactics 'B'.

116. **Preparation of Study Material for Part B and D**. The CS undertook preparation of precis and appropriate study material for Part B and Part D promotion examinations of the IA. The study material was endorsed by ARTRAC.

<u>USI – CENTRE FOR ATMA NIRBHAR BHARAT (CANB)</u>

117. The Centre has become fully functional since Jan 2024. It not only acts as a bridge between defence industry and the armed forces, but also serves as a platform to cross-fertilise ideas, and develop a robust ecosystem for indigenisation and self-reliance. The objectives of CANB are:

(a) **<u>Research and Analysis</u>**. To identify and carry out in-depth studies of international and domestic emerging trends, challenges and opportunities in emerging technology and the current aerospace and defence sector.

(b) <u>**Capacity Building**</u>. Organise training programs, workshops and conferences to enhance the capabilities of the armed forces, para militaries forces and defence industry stakeholders.

(c) <u>**Projects**</u>. Undertake projects on geopolitical research and emerging technologies including R&D for the three Services, para military forces, and corporate entities.

(d) **<u>Policy Advocacy</u>**. Engage with policymakers and government agencies for policies that support self-reliance and the growth of the defence sector.

(e) <u>**Collaboration**</u>. Provide opportunities to and facilitate collaboration between defence industries, including MSMEs, and the three Services by providing a platform for communication, partnership, and growth.

118. To meet its objectives, the Centre is undertaking:

(a) Networking and collaboration with other establishments, institutions and think tanks in India and abroad of governmental and non-governmental nature.

(b) Deliberations on Strategic Issues, Cyber Security, Hybrid Warfare, Disruptive and Technology, AI, Automation, Space Centric Warfare, Drones and UAVs.

(c) Conduct of track 1.5/2 dialogue on the geopolitics of technology.

(d) Conduct of RTDs with stakeholders to improve awareness of domestic MSMEs to defence industry and provide guidance by experienced practitioners.

(e) Participation in the tri-service projects.

119. A significant achievement has been the establishment of the 'Cyber Centre of Excellence' (CCoE) at the USI. This initiative, developed in collaboration with the Cyber Peace Foundation, represents a major step forward in fostering cyber security expertise and innovation. Phase 1 of the CCoE was inaugurated by the Chief of the Naval Staff on 15 Feb 2024. Phase II was inaugurated by Hon'ble RRM Shri Sanjay Seth, on 14 Aug 2024, further solidifying the Centre's role as a leader in the field and its commitment to advancing India's technological resilience and independence.

120. Major events conducted by the CANB during 2024 are as follows:

(a) Seventh edition of the Centre's Program 'Aavahan' to guide start-ups and MSMEs into the defence industrial ecosystem.

(b) Conclave on Aerospace and Defence Capability Roadmap - 2030 with Strategic Digest.

(c) Indo Brazil Round Table Discussion on Export of Make in India Defence Equipment.

(d) Co-hosted Outstanding Security Professional Awards – Asia, an international event at the USI.

(e) Visit of UK Delegation to CCoE.

(f) Webinar with Nirmal Bang Securities on role of AI in Financial markets and its implications.

(g) Co-hosted the India Defence Conclave with ET Now / ET Government.

(h) Co-hosted a Seminar on 'Navigating Cyber Insecurity: Building Resilience in an Interconnected World' with CSC (E-Governance), a MEITY organisation. (i) Organised a 'Cyber Swachhata Abhiyaan' for the National Security Council Sectt (NSCS) for the principals, teachers and students of Kendriya Vidyalayas at the USI. The event was inaugurated by Shri TV Ravichandran, Dy NSA.

(j) Cyber Forensics capsule for officers of CISF and Army Cyber Group. Indian and Korean instructors gave detailed talks and discussion on cyber forensic.

122. <u>First Responder Programme</u>. Cyber Peace Foundation has shortlisted the USI to conduct its 'First Responder' course. Based on these, 1,50,000 personnel will be trained by the experts from USI-CCoE on Cyber Warfare. The project is of. It aims to target NCC cadets, college students, and housewives.

123. **Projects**. Details are:

(a) A research project for NSCS on 'Enhancement of Dual Use Infrastructure and Resources for Augmenting Military Capabilities to Improve War Stamina' has been completed during the year.

(b) Cyber Peace Global Dialogue Summit, jointly with Cyber Peace Foundation, to brain storm on 'Trust and Safety in the Digital World' at IIIT, Delhi.

124. <u>**Projects in Pipeline**</u>. Cyber Warfare courses from 'Beginner to Expert' level for:

(a) Army Education Corps in Dec 2024: The Corps is under transformation and will be trained on the Cyber Warfare

(b) Assam Rifles in Dec 2024: To hone up the skills of Assam Rifles personnel on Cyber warfare.

125. <u>Research projects by Scholars</u>. The following scholar's project are in progress:

(a) 'Civil-Military Fusion: A Way Ahead in Building Infrastructure along Northern Borders' by Col Vijay Kumar Goyat, Senior Research Fellow. (b) 'Realisation of Aim of Atma Nirbhar Bharat in Defence' by Gp Capt Saminjay Kumar, Senior Research Fellow.

<u>USI - UN CELL</u>

126. The USI has played a significant role in the furtherance of India's UN Peacekeeping (UNPK) endeavours. The Centre for UNPK (CUNPK) was established by the USI, to become a regional node for excellence in UNPK under the IA. USI-UN Cell under Maj Gen PK Goswami, VSM (Retd), Deputy Director General, continues to provide necessary impetus to highlight India's contribution to UNPKO at the national and international level in a collaborative framework.

127. The USI is a founding member of the Challenges Forum and in view of the overall USI contribution to UN Peace Operations, Challenges Forum nominated USI as a member of the Partner Organisations Advisory Committee for 2024-26. USI also collaborates with the Norwegian Institute of International Affairs (NUPI), Effectiveness of Peacekeeping Network (EPON), Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI), International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), Geneva Centre for Security Policy (GCSP) and UN Women and UN Resident Coordinator (UNRC) in India, on various projects.

128. During the year 2023-24, Maj Gen (Dr) AK Bardalai (Retd), Distinguished Fellow, USI participated in a study undertaken by GCSP, in coordination with EPON, on 'The Effectiveness of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organisation (UNTSO)'. DG, USI attended the presentation of the study report to the UN in New York on 31 May 2024.

129. During the year, close interaction with ICRC further got impetuous with Mr Kedir Awol Omar, Head of Regional Delegation, showing keen interest in further collaboration with USI and conduct of a joint Seminar (Refer Para 39 for details).

130. During the year, DG and DDG participated in high-level international conferences on UNPK in New York, Japan, and Germany. Refer Para 17 for details.

133. Besides actively engaging with its partners in all UNrelated activities, USI continues to contribute contemporary articles on UN Peace Operations to make its periodical, the USI Journal, credible and attractive.
