### 'USI-War Wounded Foundation Joint Essay Competition 2026'

**Subject: Fostering Entrepreneurship among Disabled Soldiers: Opportunities, Challenges, and the Role of Government in Enabling Sustainable Ventures  
Courage and Resilience - Personal Journeys of War Wounded Achievers**

#### Concept

1. The essay on the subject should be approached keeping in mind the following:

India's disabled veteran community represents an underutilised reservoir of talent, discipline, and leadership potential. While successive governments have made meaningful commitments to veteran welfare through pension frameworks, reservation policies, and rehabilitation schemes, the specific question of entrepreneurship as a sustainable livelihood pathway for disabled soldiers remains insufficiently addressed in both policy design and academic discourse. This essay competition seeks to fill that gap. Contributors are invited to critically examine the existing ecosystem — mapping what works, what falls short, and what is absent entirely. Essays should engage with the full arc of the entrepreneurial journey for a disabled veteran: from access to seed capital and credit, to skilling and mentorship, to market linkages and procurement preferences. The particular challenges faced by soldiers disabled in combat — navigating bureaucratic processes while managing physical and psychological recovery — deserve honest and unsentimental examination. Equally, essays should articulate a forward-looking vision for government's role: not merely as a provider of welfare but as an active architect of opportunity. Essays that combine rigorous analysis with actionable policy recommendations will be given particular consideration.

#### Rules

2. The competition is open to **all members of the Indian Armed Forces, the Territorial Army, the Assam Rifles, the Senior Division of the National Cadet Corps, the Paramilitary Forces, the Police, and the Civil Administration in India, including retired personnel. Entries from foreign nationals are also accepted.**

3. Essays must be between 3,000 and 4,000 words in length, including footnotes. The word count should be mentioned in brackets at the end of the essay. **Entries that do not specify the word count or exceed the prescribed limit are liable to be rejected.**

4. The essay must be an original work by the author. Proper citation of sources is mandatory in the prescribed format. **Jointly authored essays will not be accepted. Entries found guilty of blatant plagiarism will be disqualified, and disciplinary action may be recommended.**

5. A panel of three judges appointed by the USI will evaluate the essays based on the following criteria:

(a) The extent to which the essay provides **fresh insights** into the subject.

- (b) Whether the essay, in whole or in part, is **suitable for publication**.
- (c) Understanding of the subject.
- (d) **Logical development of the theme** and coherence of thought.
- (e) Quality of **language and expression**.
- (f) Proper use of footnotes and bibliography, as applicable **Essays lacking footnotes or a bibliography will be rejected**.

6. The decision of the judges will be final. They may recommend a First Prize, which includes a **cash award of ₹15,000 and a certificate, and a Runner-up Prize, which includes a cash award of ₹10,000 and a certificate**. Winners will also receive gratis Life Membership of the USI. Additionally, the winning essay(s), if recommended by the judges, will be published in the USI Journal.

7. The Institution reserves the right to **withhold awards** if the submitted essays do not meet the required standard. Cases of plagiarism will result in disqualification.

8. **Copyright** of all submitted essays will remain with the **United Service Institution of India**.

9. Essays must be written in English, printed on one side of the paper, and double-spaced. Hard copies should be submitted in triplicate, along with a soft copy sent via email. Essays will be evaluated only after receipt of both hard and soft copies.

10. Hard copy submissions must remain **ANONYMOUS**, with no identifying details of the author included in the essay or the covering letter. **A sealed envelope must accompany the essay, containing a paper with the author's name, address, and email. Service officers must also provide their personal number, rank, date of commission, unit, address, and email.** The title of the essay should only be written on the outside of the envelope. These envelopes will be opened only during the USI Council meeting, after the judges have finalized their decision. **Essays violating the anonymity rule will be rejected.** Additionally, the email forwarding the soft copy must have only the essay title in the subject line.

11. The envelopes should be clearly marked as '**USI-War Wounded Foundation Joint Essay Competition 2026**'.
