PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR 2011**

1. Gentlemen, it gives me great pleasure to welcome you to the second meeting of the present Council. It is my privilege to present the report of the Institution for 2011. A copy of the report has been placed on the table and will be included in the minutes of the meeting. Later it will be put up on the website.

Finances

2. Audited accounts for 2010-11, Revised Estimates for 2011-12, and Budget Estimates for 2012-13 are already with you. Although there are no audit observations, our Chartered Accountant has been invited to clarify any points that you may have on the Balance Sheet.
3. Finances continue to be healthy. During 2010-11 there was surplus income over expenditure by Rs.43.75 lakhs in the Corpus Fund. However, the research centers are not able to meet their expenditure from their yearly income.
4. **Corpus Grant.** The case for allotment of Rs.10 crore corpus grant by MOD was recommended by the COSC but is pending with the MOD since long.

Membership

5. The membership continues to grow at a steady rate. As on 31 Oct 2011 the membership state was as under:-

6. Number of printed copies has been increased from 12,500 to 12,750 from quarter ending Sep 2011. 513 copies are currently being subscribed. 62 Units have taken 20 year subscription.

USI Digest

7. 2000 copies continue to be printed. Services are taking 1800 copies on special rates (Army - 1,300, Navy - 200, Air Force - 300). Some units are subscribing directly also.

Library

8. During the period 01 Nov 2010 – 31 Oct 2011, 207 books were purchased, 34 received for review, and 1433 received complimentary; the last includes 1197 books of late Maj Gen DK Palit, VrC (Retd).
9. **Digitisation.** Free of cost digitization is being done since Mar 2011 by a team of Institution of Information Technology, Allahabad under the universal library project of Carnegie Mellon

University, the funding in India being provided by Government of India. Digitisation of USI Journals, Army Lists (upto 1946) and rare books (1400) has been completed, over seven lakh pages being done.

10. **Fifth India-NATO Dialogue.** Conducted jointly with IPCS and KAS on 01 Feb 2011.
11. **Peacekeeping Vision 2015 : Capabilities for Future Mandates.** Conducted on 06-08 Apr 2011 jointly with UNDPKO and Norwegian Institute for International Affairs (NUPI).
12. **Thirty Second National Security Seminar.** Conducted on 17 – 18 Nov 2011 on the Subject "Peace and Stability in Asia – Pacific Region : Assessment of the Security Architecture". Amongst others, it was attended by 36 foreign participants from nine countries.

58. **Contact Programme DSSC (Army).** Three contact programmes were conducted this year (4 – 9 Jul, 18 – 23 Jul and 01 – 06 Aug). 180 officers attended.

59. **Total Number of Students.** This year the total number of students was 3245, surpassing all previous records. The 3000 figure was crossed for the first time last year when 3063 officers had enrolled.
